Installation Instructions

Create a folder on your server name it rsscb
Upload all of the files from the folder 'rsscb' to this new folder on your server
All files need to be in the same folder.
CHMOD (means change file permissions)

CHMOD the file codelock.php to 777
CHMOD the file auth.php to 777
CHMOD the file feedlist.php to 777
CHMOD the file settings.dat to 777

Folder "data" change permissions to 777

Setup Instructions

Visit the URL <http://yourdomain.com/rsscb/index.php>
Change the yourdomain.com part to your own domain

The default username and password are;

Username: admin
Password: admin

It is recommended that you change the username and password as soon as you log in. At the top of the RSS Builder control panel you will see a link to change username and password.

Enter the old Username and old password from above then create a new username and new password. After you create a new username and password you will be asked to log back in with your new username and password.

Modifying RSS Feeds in the List

You can add, delete or modify the RSS feeds in the default list by clicking on the link 'Modify RSS Feed List' at the top of the RSS control panel.

Creating Feeds for Your Web Pages

Step 1. Select an RSS feed

We have researched and provided an extensive list of the Top RSS feed publishers from around the internet for you in the feed list on the control panel.

But if you cannot find anything for you there then you have the option to enter your own RSS URL. The reader is compatible with RSS 2.x, 0.9x, and Atom so most any feed that is valid will show in the reader.

For really niche topics that might not have an extensive feed collection you may find what you need by using Keyword based feeds from yahoo and other sources.

Yahoo's keyword based feed is compatible with our reader.

Validate your feed using the 'Validate' form right on the control panel

Step 2. Choose Your Content Behavior Options

With these options you can customize the display of your feed.

- Open items in a new window
- Show the RSS channel Title in the Feed display
- Add RSS Channel Title to Page Title
- Show or Hide item descriptions
- Show or hide item author
- Show or hide last publish date

Randomize order if news Listings when displayed (*randomizes the order of the items being displayed in the channel, If Unchecked the news items will always appear in chronological order*)

Choose Number of News Items Random or Fixed (*Choose how many articles will appear in your feed, For a random number choose 2 different values, for a fixed number of items each time choose identical values.*)

Max Title length (limit each item's title by characters)

Max description length (Limit the length of each description)

Add rel="nofollow" to RSS links (*Check the box if you want to conserve your PR. If you are using JavaScript feeds you do not need to check this box*)

Caching – No cache will generate a new feed from the source each time the page is accessed. This puts the heaviest load on the RSS feed provider. In some cases you might want this option because you may need to have new items in the feed for each page running the feed. But the optimal choice is to cache the feeds, so that your site is not putting stress on the server providing the feeds.

Step 3. Choose Your Output Formatting Options

All of the options below are optional you can by pass them and click 'submit' leaving the default options in place.

Choose the width of your feed

Choose the background color of your feed

Choose the border color

Choose the border thickness

Choose the border style

Choose the text color

Choose the text size

Choose the text font face

Link Color

Link Style

Step 4. Choose Your New Page Options

With these options you can choose the behavior and attributes of the window that the news item pops up in.

All of the options below are optional you can by pass them and click 'submit' leaving the default options in place.

Hide the menu bar

Hide the tool bar

Hide the address field

Hide the status bar
Choose the width of the new window
Choose the height of the new window

Making Money With SearchFeed:

[Searchfeed](#) offers PPC advertising links that you can place on your webpages and earn revenue from your site traffic. Now you can take the searchfeed XML URL that is provided in your [searchfeed](#) account and use it with RSS Feed Reader. If you use search engine results with page generating tools like Traffic Equalizer etc ... then you can replace those free search engine listings with PPC listings from [searchfeed](#)!

RSSFeedReader cannot parse Searchfeed XML feeds directly because of "&" symbols in the URL.

In order to parse Searchfeed URLs through the reader you must visit the searchfeed URL in your browser

You should see a bunch of XML code in the browser.

Using the "File" menu at the top of your browser, save the page as feed.xml (or any other file name that you wish)

Up load feed.xml to your server.

Use the path to this file in the rss reader.

example: <http://yourdomain.com/feed.xml>

customize your feed like normal.

You should be aware that this technique creates a "static" feed that will never update from the source. If you choose to use this technique you should regenerate the feed a least once every 2 weeks to keep the ads fresh.

Additional Notes:

You can add RSS feeds to all of your websites from this one reader install. There is no need to re-install this application on another server. The code produced by this reader will work on any website.

Although the bandwidth used by the reader is not very significant (even with multiple sites using the feeds), it is recommended that you make sure the website where you install the reader has sufficient bandwidth to support the RSS feeds for all of your websites.

Special circumstances may require careful monitoring of your sites bandwidth, such as if you apply the RSS feeds to many dozens of websites with many hundreds or thousands of pages each and/or these sites get thousands of visitors per day.

If the website where the script is hosted goes down or experiences slow downs in service, every site carrying the feed will display an error.

Make sure the server you install the reader on has dependable uptime.
